We will also hold details of members bank account details where they have been supplied to us in connection with standing order, bank transfers, direct debits made for the purpose of supporting the charity.

We will also maintain a note of the names and addresses and contact details of boarding kennels, veterinary practices and other concerns with whom we regularly have contact.

How we will protect your data

The information is kept on a secure database, supplied by **AniLog** Animal Welfare Management Software, www.anilog.co.uk with password protected access.

Access to the site is restricted to the charity trustees only and we do not transfer or sell any information to any other body or concern. We share details of names and addresses of potential adopters and fosterers with our volunteers for the sole purpose of home check visits and will firstly have secured the agreement of the applicant before arranging the visit.

For monies paid to us on line we shall use bank transfers to our bank current account, via paypal to our account 'fundraising@hcbw.org.uk' or via virgin money.

How long will we keep your data?

We will retain your data on line for as long as you have a connection with HCBW in any capacity eg member or volunteer, Where you are a relinquisher of a dog or an adopter/fosterer of a dog we shall keep your records for the life time of the dog.
